We believe access to justice is a fundamental right in our society. “and Justice for all” is committed to providing free and low-cost legal services, for Utah’s most vulnerable citizens – people living in poverty, individuals with disabilities, veterans, seniors, minorities and victims of domestic violence.

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

Dear Friends and Supporters,

For more than 20 years, “and Justice for all” and its partners have worked hard to provide a safety net of services to Utahns facing a wide range of legal roadblocks. This year was no different. While 2020 and 2021 have presented many unique challenges because of COVID-19, “and Justice for all,” and its community partners and supporters continue to rise to that challenge. Through free or low-cost, safe, and reliable legal services, 28,505 Utahns were able to find a path forward in 2020.



This year has reminded us of the important roles home and belonging hold in our lives. Nearly one-third of deaths in the US from COVID-19 have been residents of long-term care facilities, echoing the urgency for expanded Home and Community-based services for those in need, the elderly, and people with disabilities.

We believe that access to housing fosters the kind of community people deserve. The Disability Law Center and Utah Legal Services work hard to protect the housing rights of individuals across the state every day. And yet, when housing or nutrition are secured, people still face barriers in accessing justice.

We believe safety and security are important facets of community too. For many victims of domestic violence, home does not equal safety. Legal Aid Society of Salt Lake worked tirelessly this year in remote, virtual court proceedings to provide solutions for victims of domestic violence and those in need of protective orders.

Through monumental support from its donors, “and Justice for all” reached 101% of its total 2020 campaign goal, exceeding fundraising expectations and holding strong as a powerful tool for legal aid in Utah. What could have been a financially difficult year was in the end an example of the immense generosity our community offers, even in times of crisis.

Finally, since 2002, “and Justice for all” and its partner agencies have worked in the Community Legal Center in the historic Salt Lake Lumber Building. It was the home they needed to meet the needs of a growing state 19 years ago, but in early 2020 “and Justice for all” began searching for a new Community Legal Center. At long last, a space has been chosen and a vision is brewing. With construction beginning July 2021, we cannot wait to share more details with you soon.

On behalf of the Leadership Committee, Board of Directors, and staff of “and Justice for all,” I would like to express my overflowing gratitude for the faithful and generous support offered during this truly unprecedented year. We could not have done it without you, and we continue to move forward because of you.

ABOUT “AND JUSTICE FOR ALL”

We serve thousands of low-income and disabled people each year by thoughtfully investing in legal aid programs across Utah that work. The services provided by our partner agencies and grant recipients contribute to breaking cycles of poverty, keeping families together and helping people off public assistance.

Legal Aid Society of Salt Lake



Legal Aid Society of Salt Lake (LAS) is a non-profit organization that promotes safety, stability and self-sufficiency for low income families and individuals, as well as victims of domestic violence, through effective, efficient legal advocacy and assistance including providing protective orders or civil stalking injunctions in the Third District Court in Salt Lake County.

Utah Legal Services



Utah Legal Services (ULS) is a nonprofit law office incorporated in 1976 to provide free legal help in non-criminal cases to low-income Utahns. ULS serves the entire state with offices in Salt Lake City, Ogden, Provo and St. George. Specialized units also serve groups with special legal needs including migrant farm workers, American Indians and senior citizens. Many of these poor families live great distances from the Wasatch Front and are dependent upon ULS programs for rural assistance.

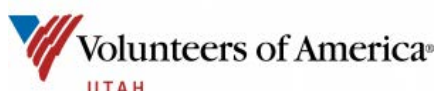
Disability Law Center



Disability Law Center (DLC) is designated by the governor to protect the civil and human rights of people with disabilities in Utah. It is part of the federally mandated Protection and Advocacy system and serves as the state’s primary legal advocacy agency for Utahns with physical, mental and developmental disabilities. The DLC provides services statewide and free of charge to all eligible person.

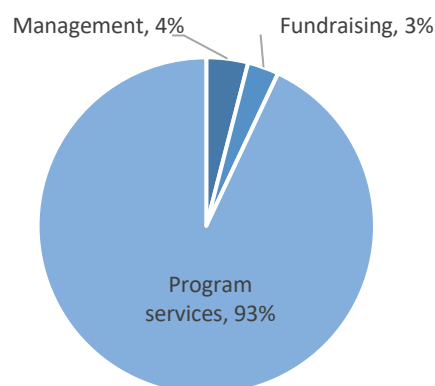

HOW YOUR SUPPORT HELPED

SARA'S STORY

It was one terrible night which left Sara, who had been married to Matt for 20 years, in the hospital. Sara had come home to an angry, drunk Matt. His rage was already bubbling, and an argument between the two of them quickly turned violent. She fumbled for her purse, scrambling to get to the car keys first. Matt banged her head against the wall, and began to kick, stomp, and strangle her. Their 8-year-old son saw it all. Sara had to save herself and her family, so she made a quick decision. She gathered her children and made a dash for the car. But Matt was not far behind. He pulled her hair, bit her ear: anything to keep her from calling for help. He snatched her phone away as Sara was finally able to lock the car doors. Using one of her children's phones, she called 911.

Matt was put in jail with a criminal no-contact order, which he violated multiple times. Sara was referred to Legal Aid Society of Salt Lake, who were able to serve Matt with a civil protective order. In light of the COVID-19 pandemic, Legal Aid staff gathered her information through their website, submit an e-filed protective order, and virtually represented Sara at her hearing. **With the support of Legal Aid Society of Salt Lake, Sara defended herself and her family from further abuse.**

JUSTIN'S STORY



Justin's case was an unfortunate misunderstanding, the likes of which happen so often in the web of social services like Section 8 housing vouchers. Many years ago, he had come close to dying when someone violently invaded his home, leaving him with a severe traumatic brain injury. When the neighbors became involved in illegal activity, he knew it would not be wise to leave it unattended. While he was away taking care of his children during the day, he asked a friend to check in on his apartment to make sure everything was okay.

Despite his responsible behavior, Justin's landlord was thought he had someone else living with him, violating the terms of his housing voucher. In the blink of an eye, the security of Justin's home was threatened by no fault of his own. When he called Utah Legal Services asking for help, they contacted his case worker, secured Justin an extension on his hearing, helped him prepare his defense, and ultimately provided enough evidence to keep Justin in his home. **Utah Legal Services was able to interrupt the cycle of homelessness and help Justin keep access to fair housing.**

MARY'S STORY

Mary was set to be discharged from inpatient rehab after a car crash left her arms and legs paralyzed. She and her husband had been preparing for the changes the accident would bring in their everyday life, looking for a solution to their inaccessible apartment. The apartment was down a flight of stairs, which Mary could not use in her motorized wheelchair. Her husband was prepared, securing fully accessible housing for them both by the time she was ready to leave the hospital. They made a formal request to their landlord to be released from the lease agreement, and gave a clear explanation of Mary's need for accommodation.

Despite the clear need for accommodation, Mary's landlord denied them and threatened to tarnish her credit and rental history if they continued to pursue a new apartment. But Mary and her husband quickly contacted the Disability Law Center with their case. The DLC was able to represent Mary and obtain a binding agreement with her landlord, which released her and her husband from their lease agreement on the date of her discharge at no extra cost.

If it weren't for the advocacy of the DLC and the services they provide, Mary and her husband would not have had the resources to defend the rights of people with disabilities like herself.
